C. Highlights of the Year

1.True Woman '25 Conference (Indianapolis, USA 2-4 October 2025)

Two members of our team, Estelle Drysdale and Theresa Rabie, had the opportunity to attend the True Woman '25 Conference (TW25),



hosted by *Revive Our Hearts* at the Indiana Convention Centre in Indianapolis, USA. This global gathering brought together thousands of women from more than 50 countries, both in person and online, creating a unified focus on God's Word and its transforming work.

The TW25 theme, *The Word – Behold the Wonder*, called women to renewed reverence for Scripture, with a strong emphasis on loving the Word, living the Word, and beholding the



wonder of God's truth. The teaching consistently pointed to the sufficiency and authority of Scripture and its central role in the life of the believer.

The main sessions were led by Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth, alongside a team of Bible teachers, including Mary Kassian, Dannah Gresh, Katie McCoy, Courtney Doctor, Melissa Kruger, Erin Davis, Gretchen Saffles, Karen Ellis and others. Their teaching strengthened biblical conviction, deepened understanding of God's Word, and encouraged gospel-centred living across all generations.

2.Take Heart - God is Faithful! Women's Camp, Pretoria

From 26–28 September 2025, *Revive Our Hearts South Africa* hosted its first women's camp, Take Heart – God Is Faithful!

Thirty-seven women attended the camp, representing diverse cultural backgrounds and life stages. Teaching from Psalm 107, by Retha de Villiers and Jackie Arndt, focused on God's faithfulness through every season of life. Worship, prayer, reflection areas, and fellowship created opportunities for spiritual renewal and deeper discipleship.

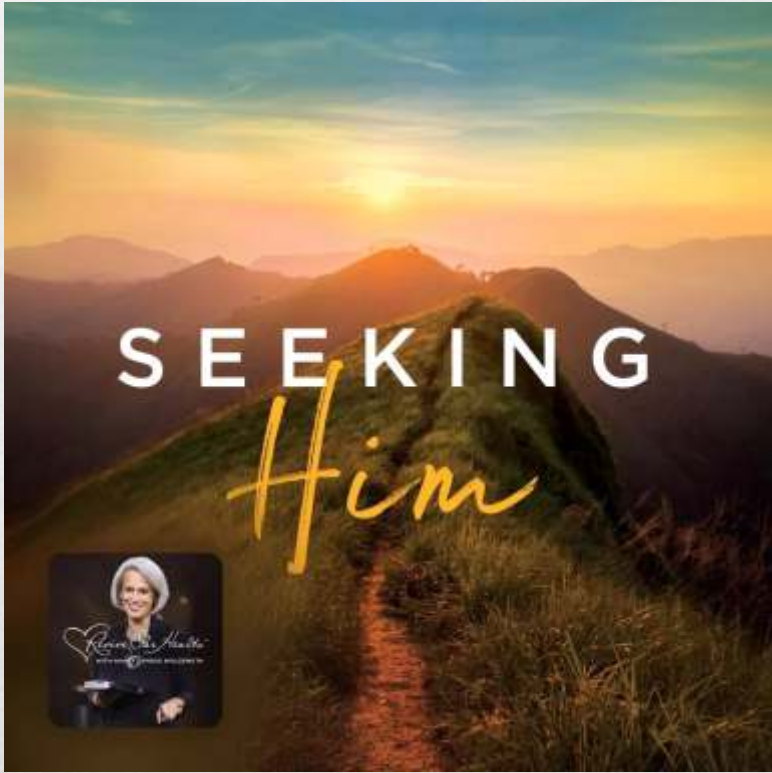
3. Seeking Him Podcast

ENCOURAGING ENGAGEMENT THROUGH SCRIPTURE

Read Through the Bible continues to equip and encourage readers in both Afrikaans and English, fostering daily engagement with God's Word.



Although monthly readership declined slightly during the first four months of the year, reader engagement remains encouraging. Between January and April, Afrikaans readers submitted 1,262 comments, reflecting meaningful interaction with the content. Positive feedback also continues through various WhatsApp groups.

The RTTB audio project also continued to move forward. Significant progress was made in establishing technical benchmarks for recordings and resolving setup

challenges, allowing the project to enter a stable and encouraging phase.

Throughout the year, the team remained grateful for God's faithfulness and continued to pray for wisdom, perseverance, technical solutions, timely completion of recordings and editing, and for more women to become involved in the ministry.

1.2 Seeking Him Podcast

Seeking Him - Spoken Languages

The Seeking Him podcast translation and recording ministry in South Africa is driven by committed volunteers from native cultural groups, including Xitsonga, Tshivenda, Setswana and Afrikaans. During the past five years, the team has developed a structured translation process to ensure that messages remain faithful to *Revive Our Hearts* doctrine, are culturally relevant, and maintain consistency across languages.

Language Expansion:

We have seen encouraging growth in our translation ministry during this year.

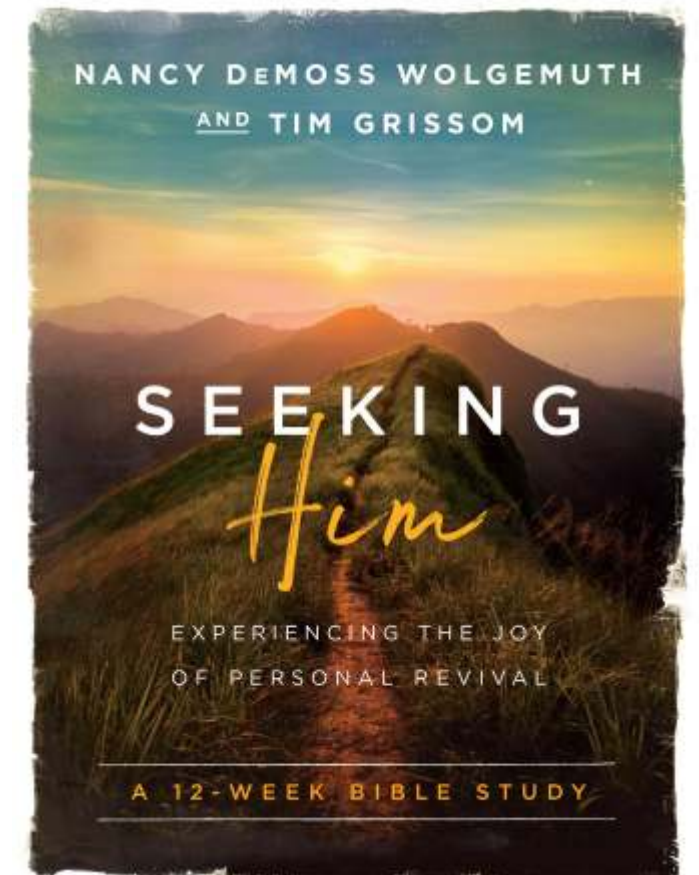
We expanded from two active languages, Afrikaans and Xitsonga, to five in total, adding Setswana, Tshivenda and Sepedi. In addition, SiSwati translation work is currently in development.

We have also made good progress towards our goal of having at least two translators for every language; to date we have achieved approximately 60% of this target.

Output Growth:

There is a clear shift from development to consistent weekly distribution:

- Xitsonga, Tshivenda and Setswana - two messages per week (since 12 January 2026);
- Afrikaans and English - five messages per week (ongoing); and
- Sepedi - launched in February 2026 (we are working towards two messages per week).

Team & Leadership

Development:

ROH SA's capability has grown from a small translation base to a multi-language team, including trained and trainee translators.

Operational Development:

Bi-weekly meetings have been established to ensure accountability and continuous training and support.

We transitioned from WhatsApp calls to Zoom or Teams meetings, which has improved participation and meeting capacity. In addition we have implemented a translation framework, to ensure clarity, cultural relevance and biblical integrity, across all languages.

The ministry is now in a structured growth phase, with consistent output across multiple languages and a growing team that supports further expansion into underserved language communities.

Seeking Him - South African Sign Language

A promising new initiative emerged in August of 2025 through discussions with leaders serving within Deaf communities. In January 2026, translation of selected messages from the Seeking Him podcast into South African Sign Language (SASL) began. This initiative aligns closely with our commitment to making biblical truth accessible to all people of SA, and creating greater opportunities for discipleship among Deaf communities. Considering that SASL is the twelfth official language of South Africa, this initiative is especially close to our hearts.

The first Seeking Him visual podcast messages were recorded in February 2026. The project is now well underway using the WhatsApp community platform and our YouTube channel to broadcast the podcasts. Eunice van Vuuren, from the Deaf Community, is our SASL interpreter.



The Broadcast Ministry continued to grow during the reporting period, reaching 391 members across six language streams. English and Afrikaans remain the largest, while Setswana, Tshivenda, Xitsonga & Sepedi broadcasts continue to expand their reach.

Key developments included the launch of weekly African language broadcasts via WhatsApp; the growth of the Afrikaans archive to more than 1,000 recordings and transcripts; and the submission of selected Afrikaans content to YouVersion Reading Plans. Together, these initiatives have increased accessibility, strengthened multilingual ministry outreach, and extended ROH SA reach in South Africa.

1.3 Translation & Local Printing of Resources

1.3.1 While You Wait for Your Prodigal

While You Wait for Your Prodigal's Afrikaans translation, *Terwyl Jy vir Jou Verlore Geliefde Wag*, was completed during the reporting period and the first 100 books of the 30-day prayer challenge were printed and distributed.

1.3.2 Local Printing of ROH Resources

Five ROH publications, including three of the Women of the Bible series of books, were printed in South Africa during this reporting period: *Rahab*, *Ruth* and *Esther*. In addition *The Power of Words* and its Afrikaans translation, *Die Krag van Woorde*, have also been printed locally, resulting in significant savings in landed cost. This in turn enables ROH SA to pass on the savings to the end users, removing one of the significant obstacles experienced when importing from the USA. We'd like to thank our American liaison, Hanah Kurz, in particular for her efforts in making this possible.

As we have spent most of our resources and focus on large projects such as the Wonder of the Word, no new *ROH SA* resources were developed during this period. We have, however, participated in other South African milestones.

2.1 YouVersion Bible Reading Plans

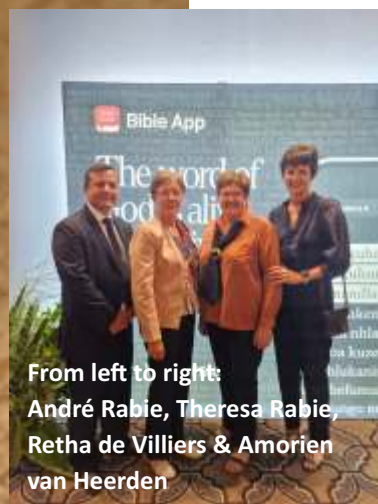
Launch of the YouVersion South Africa Office

A significant occasion was celebrated on 26 February 2026 with the official launch of the YouVersion South Africa office in Cape Town, the mother city founded in the shadow of the iconic Table Mountain. Ministry leaders, partners, and supporters gathered in anticipation of a new chapter in the expansion. YouVersion's South African hub chose *ROH SA* as one of 4 ministries to invest in.

With nearly 29 million subscribers to The Bible App in South Africa, the launch reflects both the growing engagement with Scripture and the ongoing opportunity to reach more people with biblical resources. *Revive Our Hearts South Africa* is honoured to be part of this initiative, supporting efforts to inspire and impact lives through greater access to God's Word.

During the launch event, the YouVersion team shared their vision for the future, drawing inspiration from Isaiah 54:2: "Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtains wide, do not hold back." This Scripture served as a reminder of the call to expand the reach of the Gospel and remain open to the opportunities God is creating.

We celebrate this milestone with gratitude and move forward in faith, confident that God will continue to open doors for greater Kingdom impact across South Africa and beyond.

1. Equipping & Supporting Women Leaders

1.1 Team Development & Management

31 May to 3 June 2025, 16 members of the *ROH SA* team gathered in Pretoria for a dedicated time of leadership development, spiritual renewal and team building. After months of prayerful preparation, the gathering provided an opportunity to invest intentionally in the people who serve and lead within the ministry. A significant focus of the event was the development of the Ambassador Program.



Alongside leadership training by Jannie de Villiers, the Chairman of our board, the program created space for personal spiritual renewal and reflection. The team members were encouraged to deepen their identity in Christ, strengthen their dependence on God, and renew their commitment to the ministry.

Arnel Huisamen shared insights into our team's strengths and introduced the Tall Trees Leadership profile. These sessions fostered collaboration and improved understanding of individual gifts.

The gathering concluded with a time of commissioning and vision casting by Retha de Villiers, during which team members reaffirmed their commitment to the ministry and it's calling to encourage women toward wholehearted devotion to Christ. The investment made through this event has strengthened leadership capacity, enhanced team cohesion, and positioned *ROH SA* for continued ministry growth and impact in the years to come.

1.2 Ambassador Program

Ambassador Training

The most significant development in the Ambassador Program over the reporting period was the training and commissioning of five new Area Ambassadors in June 2025. This is a meaningful milestone for *Revive Our Hearts South Africa*. We were honoured to have Angela Temples, *ROH* Director of the Ambassadors, and Monica Vaught, *ROH* Human Resources Director (both from the USA Head Office), lead our first training sessions via Zoom. Wilmie van Tonder, the Ambassador Lead in South Africa, was also instrumental in strengthening and supporting the Ambassador training.

1.2 Ambassador Program (cont.)

As a result, the Ambassador Program has now expanded across four of SA's nine provinces: Western Cape, Gauteng, Free State & Mpumalanga, with a presence in six cities.

Throughout the year, Ambassadors focused on creating opportunities to encourage, equip, and connect with women leaders and influencers. This took place primarily through conferences, regional gatherings, and one-on-one engagements with church leaders across diverse denominations and cultural contexts.

Conferences in Mpumalanga and the Western Cape played a particularly important role, bringing women together, strengthening unity, and introducing many women leaders to *Revive Our Hearts'* resources.

Langebaan Leadership Workshop – The Joy of Journaling in God's Word

In January 2026, Theresa Rabie, the Ambassador in Langebaan (Western Cape), facilitated a leadership-focused workshop for 10 elders' wives, from Advance churches, across the West Coast. The gathering provided a valuable opportunity for spiritual encouragement, personal growth, and ministry development among women serving in key leadership support roles.

The workshop centred on *The Joy of Journaling in God's Word*, featuring teaching by Nancy DeMoss

Wolgemuth, utilising True Woman '25 resources. Participants engaged with the content through a combination of video, audio and printed materials, enabling a rich and interactive learning experience.

In addition to exploring the spiritual discipline of Bible journaling, participants reflected on the diverse ways women learn and engage with biblical teaching. These discussions generated valuable insights into effective discipleship and communication approaches, with practical implications for ministry within their local church contexts.

Participant feedback was heart-warming, affirming both the relevance of the content and the value of creating intentional spaces to encourage and equip ministry leaders' wives. A direct outcome of the workshop was a request for a follow-up, demonstrating a desire for continued training and deeper engagement with *Revive Our Hearts* teaching resources.

2. Equipping Women of All Generations & Cultures

2.1 Take Heart – God is Faithful Women's Camp

Women's Camp, Pretoria (26–28 September 2025)

In September 2025, *Revive Our Hearts South Africa* hosted our first women's camp, Take Heart – God Is Faithful. The camp welcomed 37 women (close to the target of 40), creating space for deeper discipleship, fellowship, and spiritual renewal during the weekend.

The group reflected an encouraging diversity, with women from different ethnic and cultural backgrounds participating.

Retha de Villiers and Jackie Arndt's teaching from Psalm 107, focused on God's faithfulness through every season of life. Five interactive reflection stations were created to complement the teaching. These provided opportunities for prayer, meditation and personal response.

Worship was led by Gerda Mare, whose authentic approach encouraged meaningful engagement throughout the weekend.

The camp was hosted at Pure Joy Guest Lodge, which provided a beautiful setting, comfortable accommodation and satisfactory meals.

Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, highlighting the value of a retreat environment where women can step away from daily responsibilities and spend time dedicated to the Lord.

The planning and serving team of 6 *ROH SA* team members worked diligently to ensure the camp's success, strengthening both ministry impact and team unity. As a result, the team believes future camps should be strongly considered due to their significant spiritual impact and the evident need for this type of ministry opportunity.

2.2 Take Heart – God is Faithful West Coast Event

Women's Event, Langebaan



On 28 August, 221 women gathered at Beacon Church in Langebaan for an evening of worship, biblical encouragement and renewal.

The guest speaker, Retha de Villiers, shared a message from Psalm 107, reminding women that God's steadfast love remains constant through every season of life. The biblical teaching resonated deeply and brought encouragement to many.

Beautifully designed reflection spaces throughout the venue provided opportunities for prayer, reflection and response to God's Word. Together with heartfelt worship led by an all-women worship team, these spaces helped create an atmosphere in which many women found encouragement and renewed hope.

The evening was undergirded by faithful intercession, with prayer teams supporting the event both before and during the gathering.

Revive Our Hearts resources were also available, and it was encouraging to hear how many women were already familiar with the ministry's Bible studies.

2.3 True Women '25 Mini Conference

Mbombela Conference 2026 – Behold: The Wonder of the Word

Angie Grobler coordinated the fifth annual *Revive Our Hearts* Conference in Mbombela (Mpumalanga), with the theme "Behold: The Wonder of the Word." Despite significant logistical and technical challenges in the lead-up to the event (including venue changes, unstable electricity, inconsistent internet connectivity and even a complete power outage the evening before the conference!), the event itself proceeded smoothly, demonstrating God's faithful provision throughout.



The conference welcomed 25 attendees and featured teaching content from speakers including Kevin DeYoung, Dannah Gresh and Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth. Sessions were complemented by personal testimonies, interactive discussion opportunities, and a strong emphasis on the Read Through the Bible (RTTB) initiative.

Participant feedback was exceptionally positive, representing the most encouraging response to date at this conference location. The event highlighted the continued effectiveness of the Ambassador-led conference model, the value of prayer support, and the ongoing impact of *Revive Our Hearts'* biblical teaching ministry in the region.

2.4 Klerksdorp Devotional Gathering – Finding Jesus in the Psalms

A *Revive Our Hearts*-aligned devotional gathering was hosted at the Klerksdorp Methodist Church (Northwest Province), bringing together 12 women from different denominations and demonstrating the ministry's growing interdenominational reach.

Facilitated by local *ROH* advocate, Yvette Fraser, the session focused on Finding Jesus in the Psalms and encouraged participants to engage at a deeper, Christ-centred, level with Scripture.

The program incorporated teaching drawn from True Woman '25 conference resources, supported by biblical commentary, a presentation on the Book of Psalms, and additional teaching content from Dannah Gresh. Participants engaged in guided reflection, group discussion, and interactive learning activities designed to reinforce key biblical themes.

The gathering also served as an opportunity to raise awareness of *Revive Our Hearts SA* by distributing ministry resources and *ROH* publications. Feedback was encouraging, with participants expressing eagerness for ongoing devotional gatherings in 2026.



2.5 Prayer Challenges

While You Wait for Your Prodigal – 30-Day Prayer Challenge

Building on the strong response to previous prayer initiatives, the While You Wait for Your Prodigal Prayer Challenge was repeated in May 2025 in both Afrikaans and English. The challenge generated significant engagement, with 284 women participating in the Afrikaans group and 491 women in the English group via WhatsApp.

The initiative provided a structured prayer journey for women carrying a burden for prodigal loved ones and demonstrated the effectiveness of digital platforms in fostering spiritual encouragement.



Husband Encouragement – 30-Day Challenge

In June 2025, *ROH SA* team member Inge Coetsee launched a Husband Encouragement Challenge with her local Bible study group. What began as a small initiative involving five

women experienced exponential growth, increasing to 55 participants within days!

The challenge encouraged women to intentionally pray for, affirm, and support their husbands through biblically grounded practical application. The response highlighted both the relevance of the topic and the effectiveness of peer-led ministry initiatives.

2.6 World Day of Prayer for Women

The World Day of Prayer for Women was held virtually on 7 March 2025, bringing together women from across South Africa and around the world for a time of focused intercession. Conducted via Zoom, the event centred on prayer for oppressed women, burdened women, widows and the fatherless. The gathering reflected the ministry's commitment to mobilizing women in prayer and fostering unity across geographical and denominational boundaries. Participants were encouraged through biblical teaching, testimonies, and guided prayer, creating a meaningful shared experience of faith and support.



2.7 Bible Study Ministry

The Bible Study Ministry continued to demonstrate steady growth, meaningful participant engagement, and increasing accessibility through both in-person and online formats.

The online *Abigail* Bible study, led by Theresa Rabie and conducted between August and September 2025, engaged 10 participants from South Africa and

Mozambique. The study demonstrated the effectiveness of digital discipleship in fostering meaningful connection, cross-cultural engagement, and spiritual growth, while extending the ministry's reach beyond geographical boundaries.

A significant trend emerging is the growing demand for online Bible studies. Time constraints, geographical distance and accessibility, are among the considerations affecting participation.

This presents a strategic opportunity for future ministry growth by expanding digital initiatives, while maintaining the depth of biblical engagement and the essence of community that characterize the ministry.

2.8 Book Sales

60 *ROH SA* Parcels, containing various resources, were sent to 39 different towns in South Africa during this report period. This shows a steady increase of influence and reach within the country.



III. Expansion of Revive Our Hearts SA

1. Opportunities for Expansion

1.1 Radio

GROOTFM 90.5

Revive Our Hearts SA had the privilege of broadcasting 21 Seeking Him messages in Afrikaans on GROOTFM 90.5 as part of their Women's Month focus. A big thank you to Corné Loots, who had to redo the recording process of these messages to adapt them to the radio format.



Retha de Villiers had the opportunity to speak on GROOT FM about *ROH* on 17 August 2025. She used the opportunity to invite listeners to the Take Hearts camp and talk about the Wonder of the Word project.

Tygerberg 104FM

On 20 February 2026, Theresa Rabie participated in a live interview on Radio Tygerberg 104FM. This opportunity provided valuable exposure for the ministry through a trusted Christian media platform serving listeners across the Western Cape and beyond. While brief, the interview enabled listeners to share in our vision and increase awareness about our resources among a broad audience. We believe that every opportunity to engage through Christian radio helps expand our reach and connects more women to the ministry.



A single five-minute broadcast on Radio Tygerberg 104FM could reach an estimated 8,000–25,000 listeners in the Cape Town area, depending on program placement and timing. With the station's broader weekly reach of approximately 170,000 listeners across the Western Cape, even a short segment creates significant ministry visibility. In practical terms, one interview can reach more people than many physical events combined, carrying biblical encouragement into homes, vehicles, workplaces and churches throughout the region.

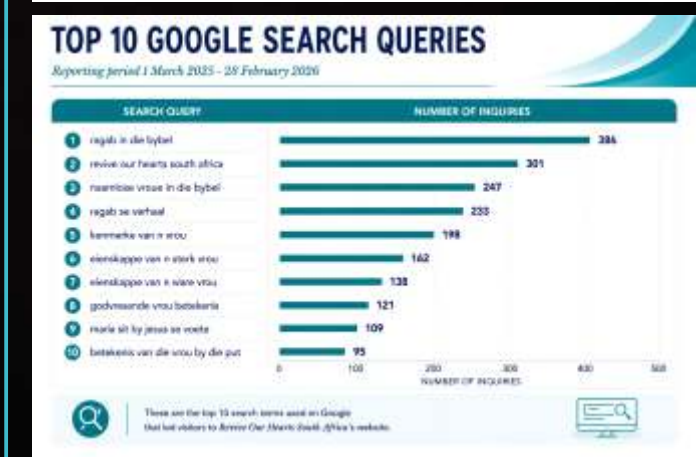

"I am a South African missionary working in Mozambique. Revive Our Hearts has been part of my life for probably the last 10 years. I listen to the podcasts on almost a daily basis. Last year, a missionary friend of mine asked me if I could give her English lessons. She is Mozambican and wanted to improve her language skills. We started having English lessons online as we both lived in different cities. To help with her listening skills, I sent her the links to Revive Our Hearts podcasts. In the beginning, she would listen to a podcast two or three times to understand it! But with time, she got better and later on would only listen to it once, understanding everything. She really loved the teaching, and I remember how she listened to the first message in a series that Nancy did on Proverbs 31. It made an impact on her about how it is her responsibility to show the Lord to her children in a purposeful way. I remember how we shared together, and she even had tears as she prayed that she would be that kind of mother to her daughters. My friend enjoyed the podcasts so much that she started using them for discipling younger girls. Right now, she is using the Esther series in discipling another young lady. What I started as an activity to practice listening skills turned into a ministry resource that has greatly blessed both of us.
